## **Teaching Suggestions**

Critical thinking is about making informed decisions. Students are asked to answer questions of the worksheet using ONLY information provided in the slideshow (and/or video) and what they can infer.

Depending on how much time you have, you can provide different amounts of information. How do cur answers change as we become more "full-minded" with primary-source information?

## Teaching Option 1: ONE round of information

Watch the video. Students fill out worksheets.

## Teaching Option 2: TWO rounds of information

- Teach the slideshow lesson. Students fill out worksheets.
- Watch the video starting at the beginning. How do your answers change?

## Teaching Option 3: THREE rounds of information

- Teach the slideshow lesson and have students fill out worksheets.
- Watch the video starting with the keynote speech. How do your answers change?
